



Transfer Student Scholarships

ELIGIBILITY

New transfer students admitted for the fall 2020 and spring 2021 semesters will be considered for merit and need-based scholarship opportunities. Eligibility is determined at the time of admission. A student must be eligible to receive federal aid and have submitted a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov to be considered for need-based scholarships. Students not meeting the transfer application deadline: June 1 for fall enrollment; or December 1 for spring enrollment will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Exact scholarship amounts within each range will be determined by a holistic review of the application for admission. Students enrolled less than full time, those attending a regional campus, and students who have already earned a bachelor's degree are not eligible.

PRIORITY DEADLINES

Fall semester: Apply by June 1

Spring semester: Apply by December 1
