

Winter Term 2013-14 Parking Guide

Parking Permits Required: Temporary permits available at \$10 per week

A permit is required to park in a University parking lot or on a University drive at all times. A student may obtain up to four weeks of temporary permit privileges each semester for his or her own vehicle only. Temporary permits may be purchased at the Parking & Transportation Services office, there is a \$10 fee per week.

Parking lot restrictions will remain in effect over Winter Term (January 2-24). Please park in lots according to your permit's privilege and the posted restrictions.

Spring Semester Parking Permits on Sale Fri., Dec. 6

Spring semester parking permits for students went on sale online on Friday, December 6. Spring semester parking permits are valid from December 14, 2013 until May 16, 2014. Student areas (blue) parking permits are \$115 per semester and holding lots (yellow) parking permits are \$60 per semester. Permits may be purchased online by visiting the parking services website at: <http://www.MiamiOH.edu/parking> and clicking the "Online Parking Services" icon on the right margin. Permits will be charged to a student's Bursar account.

Locations Where Overnight Parking Is Permitted

Student vehicles with a valid permit (blue or yellow) may park in the Ditmer or West Millett parking lots for the duration of the winter break. No overnight parking is permitted in Miami's parking garage unless a student has already purchased overnight parking access.

Parking on Oxford City Streets – prohibited for more than 72 consecutive hours. Play it safe and purchase a temporary parking permit from Parking Services

Oxford city ordinances prohibit parking on city streets (including Oak St., Maple St., Patterson Ave., and Tallawanda Rd.) for more than 72 consecutive hours. Many Oxford streets are also designated as snow routes where parking is prohibited when snowfall reaches 3 inches or greater. Students living off-campus may wish to purchase a temporary parking permit and store their vehicle in the North Campus Garage over the Thanksgiving break to avoid fines, immobilization or towing for being parked over 72 hours on a city street or on a snow route in the event of snow. BCRTA Campus and Regional Transit Routes
