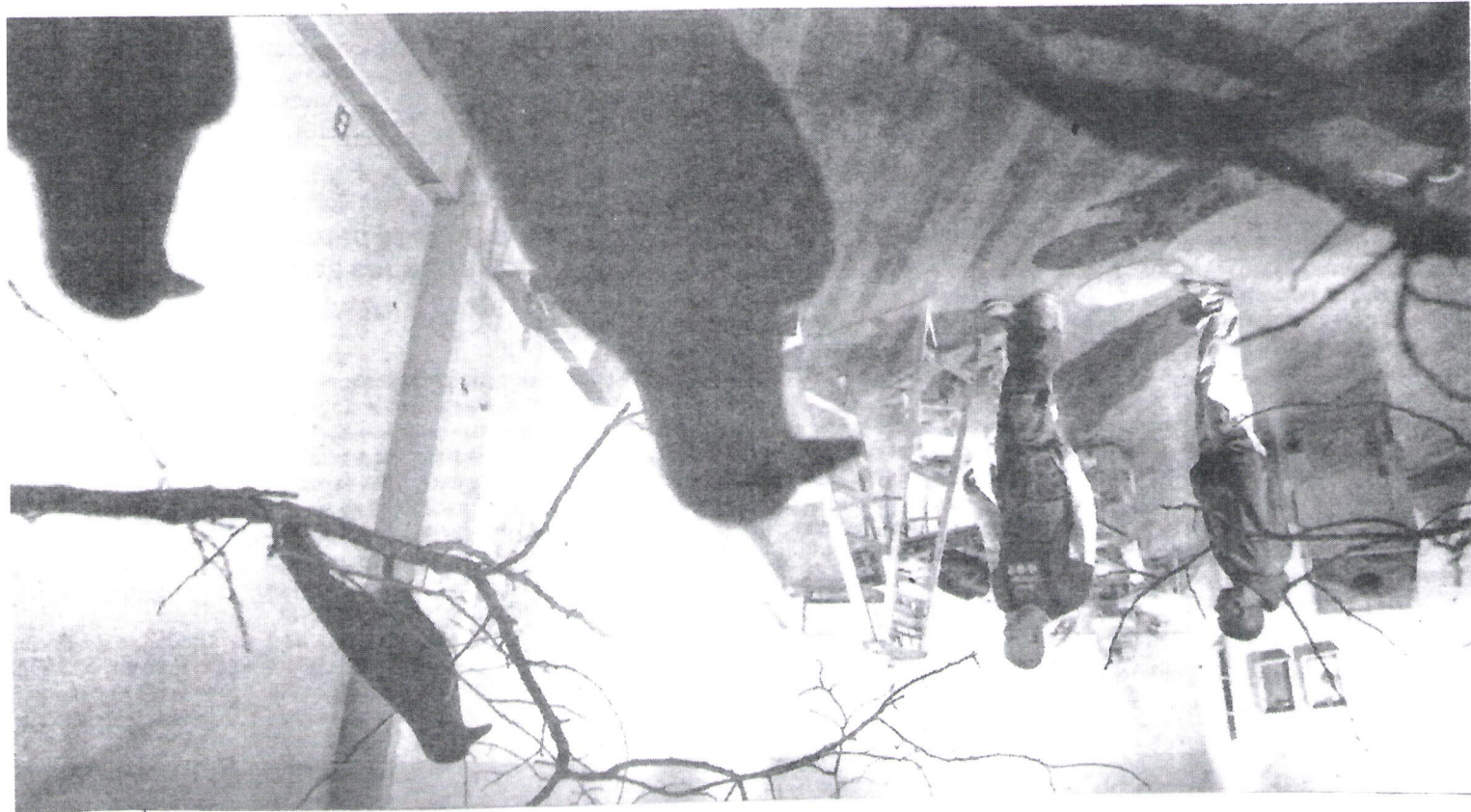


Installation for Earth & Sky exhibit at Fitton Center
