





First-year students can apply for the Honors College by indicating their interest on their admission application. For priority consideration, complete your admission application by **Dec. 1**.



FIRST-YEAR HONORS RESIDENTIAL COLLEGE

Reach your fullest academic and personal potential when you live and study alongside your fellow Honors College students. The intentional community in the Honors Residential College (HRC) combines state-of-the-art amenities with a full slate of academic and social activities.

PRESIDENTIAL FELLOWS PROGRAM

The elite Presidential Fellows Program offers a four-year renewable scholarship covering tuition, fees, housing, and food for 15 of the brightest scholars and leaders in the Honors College. In addition, Presidential Fellows receive a \$5,000 academic enrichment stipend.

PRODESSE SCHOLARSHIP

A \$1,000-\$2,000 award renewable annually for four years, the Prodesse Scholarship is awarded to top Honors College students.

ADDITIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Additional scholarships are granted to high-achieving admitted students based on their high school GPA (see Page 23 for details).





Tuition made transparent

Miami’s Tuition Promise ensures that most costs (including tuition, housing, food, special purpose fees, and course fees) for new undergraduate students are frozen for up to four years. **This means scholarships and financial aid retain their full value all four years.**

SPECIAL PURPOSE AND COURSE FEES*

- College of Creative Arts: \$50 per semester fee for students majoring in Architecture, Interior Design, Music, Music Education, or Music Performance.
- College of Engineering and Computing: \$595 per semester fee for students majoring within the College of Engineering and Computing.
- Farmer School of Business: \$132 per credit hour fee for most business school courses.
- Other courses, such as labs, may include additional fees. Be sure to check the course information when registering.

Scholarships and financial aid

MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Miami offers merit scholarships to qualified high school students who enroll full time on our Oxford campus beginning in the fall semester. Students who complete their admission application by the Dec. 1 priority deadline and meet the minimum academic criteria below will be considered. Students who apply later will be considered based on availability. No separate scholarship application is necessary. Scholarships are not guaranteed. ADDITIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Applicants who do not meet the criteria for merit scholarships listed below will still be considered for merit and need-based scholarships with values up to full tuition. Factors including diversity, audition, portfolio, academic interest, and athletic ability will be used to award these scholarships. To maximize scholarship consideration, students should apply for admission and **file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**.

NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

Financial need is determined by the FAFSA. To maximize consideration for need-based scholarships and financial aid, students should apply for admission and file a FAFSA by **Feb. 1**.

*Miami uses the weighted GPA on a student’s transcript. If your school does not calculate a weighted GPA, Miami will recalculate your GPA for you, adding weight based on coursework difficulty. If you have taken rigorous classes, your recalculated GPA likely will be higher than your high school GPA.

**Scholarships are renewable for up to four years, provided students meet renewability requirements.

How to apply

Dec. 1, 2024, is the priority deadline to be considered for Miami’s merit scholarships and competitive programs, including Nursing, the Farmer School of Business, and the Honors College. Those who apply later will be considered for these opportunities as space and resources allow.

Students applying for fall 2025 are not required to provide an ACT or SAT test score for admission or scholarship consideration.

UNDERSTANDING APPLICATION TYPES

EARLY DECISION (BINDING)

If admitted, applicants are contractually obligated to withdraw applications to all other institutions and accept their offer of admission with Miami by Jan. 15. They receive full consideration for merit scholarships (see Page 23).

EARLY ACTION AND EARLY ACTION II (NON-BINDING)

Applicants are not contractually obligated to Miami and have until May 1 to accept their offer of admission. They receive full consideration for merit scholarships (see Page 23).

REGULAR DECISION (NON-BINDING)

Admission to some majors is typically more competitive for students who apply Regular Decision. Merit scholarships will be considered based on availability. Applicants have until May 1 to accept their offer of admission.
