Scholarships

First year international students who apply by our Dec. 1 priority deadline are automatically considered for most Miami merit scholarships, including:

- University merit and educational scholarships: \$2500 to \$16,000 per year.
- #YouAreWelcomeHere Scholarship: Up to 50% tuition (separate application required).
- Prodesse Scholarship: \$1000 \$2000 per year (Honors College students).
- Presidential Fellows Program: full tuition, fees, housing, and meals (Honors College students; firm Dec. 1 deadline).

International transfer students also are considered for transfer scholarships at the time of admission.



Special Purpose and Course Fees:

College of Engineering and Computing: \$595 per semester fee for students majoring within the College of Engineering and Computing.

Farmer School of Business: \$132 per credit hour fee for most business school courses.


