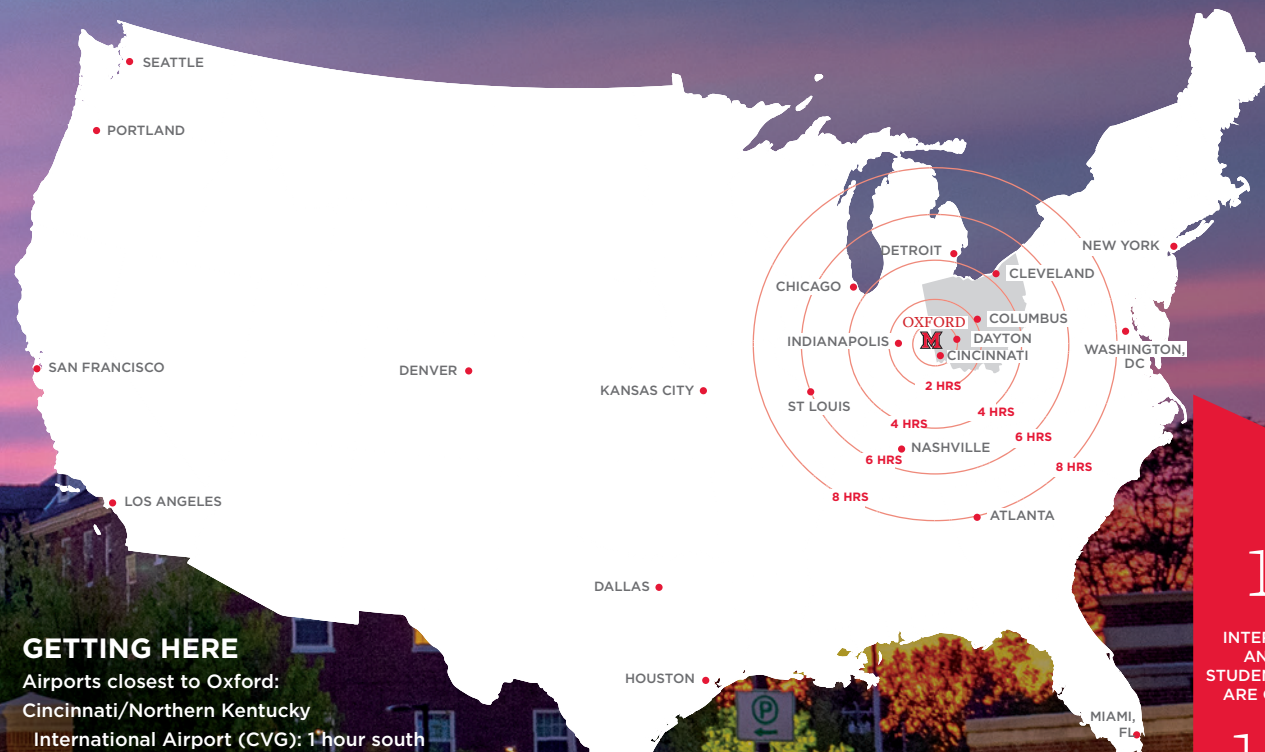

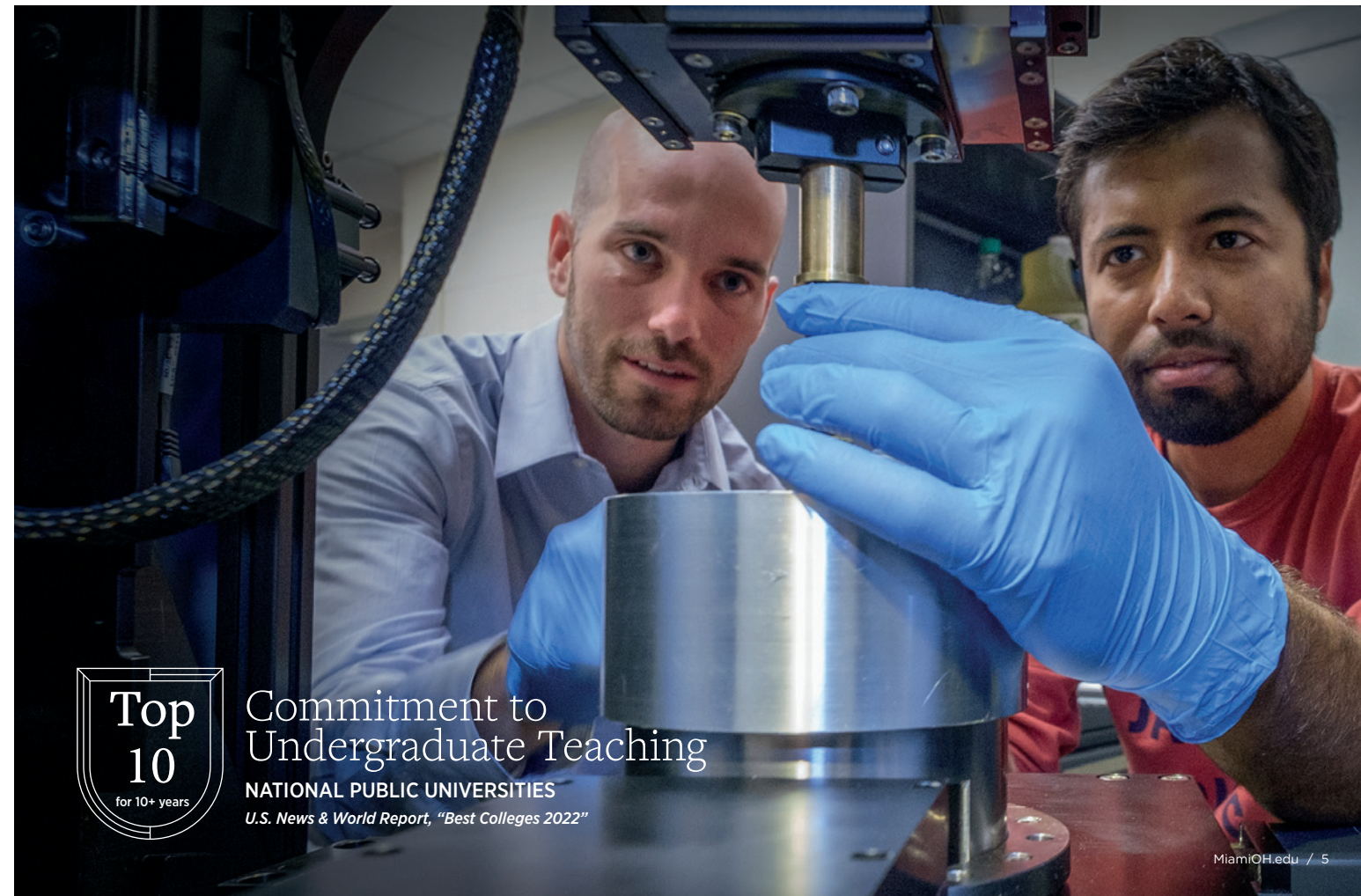

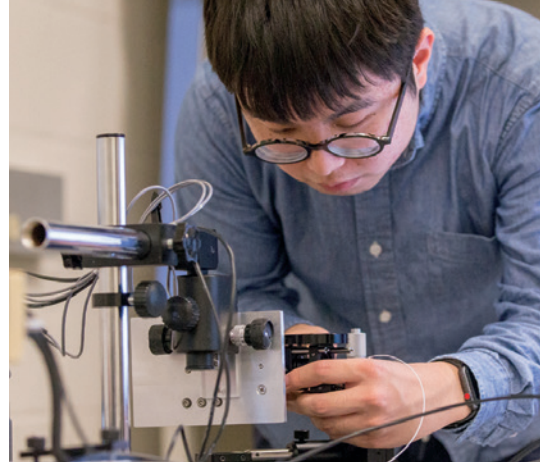

# How to apply

## APPLICATION TYPES

- International: Non-U.S. citizens or non-permanent U.S. residents
- First-year: Students in their final year of secondary/high school
- Transfer: Students previously or currently enrolled at a university

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Complete academic records
- Common Application or Miami Application; \$70 application fee
- Proof of English language proficiency
- Recommendation letter (optional)

## I-20 REQUIREMENTS

- Copy of passport or national identification card
- International Student Financial Support Form
- Financial verification

## SAT OR ACT REQUIREMENTS

International students are not required to provide an ACT or SAT score, but they may use the ACT or SAT to satisfy English language proficiency requirements.

Miami's testing policy for Canadian and international students who have attended a U.S. high school for three or more years is the same as it is for U.S. students – an ACT or SAT test score is not required for students applying for fall 2023.

# A great education made affordable

## FALL 2023 MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Miami offers merit scholarships to qualified first-year students who enroll full time on our Oxford campus beginning the fall semester. Students who complete their admission application by the Dec. 1 priority deadline and meet the minimum academic criteria below will be considered. Students who apply later will be considered based on availability. No separate scholarship application in necessary. Scholarships are not guaranteed.

4.30+	\$15,000 to \$34,000
3.95-4.29	\$10,000 to \$23,000
3.75-3.94	\$6,000 to \$18,000
3.50-3.74	Up to \$12,000

\*Miami calculates an equivalent U.S. GPA on a 4.0 scale for all international applicants educated outside the U.S. educational system. For international students at U.S. high schools (or those that follow a U.S. high school curriculum and grading system), Miami will recalculate your GPA to provide a weighted GPA if your school does not already add weight.

\*\*Scholarships are renewable for up to four years, provided students meet renewability requirements.



## INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships range from \$2,500 to \$12,000 per year, renewable for up to four years. Awards are based on academic records and other information provided at the time of application. Apply for admission by Dec 1. for priority consideration.

## #YOUAREWELCOMEHERE SCHOLARSHIP

Up to two scholarships are awarded to international students with a vision for enhancing intercultural understanding. Awards cover a minimum of 50 percent of tuition, renewable for up to four years. Complete a separate scholarship application by Dec. 1.

## INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

Qualified international transfer applicants will be considered for scholarships based on academic and other information provided at the time of application.
