Department of Anthropology Student Research Award

Guidelines for Application AY 2025-2026

We are excited to announce a new funding opportunity for our anthropology majors and minors wishing to conduct or present their primary research in archaeology, cultural anthropology, linguistic anthropology, and/or medical anthropology. These Student Research funds are the result of donations to the Department of Anthropology's Move-in-Miami campaign in addition to additional donations from Rob and Nancy Tolley.

The department offers two award opportunities each academic year: Fall Deadline: December 1, 2025 to apply to conduct research or present research over Winter/Spring 2026.

Spring deadline: April 1, 2026 to apply to conduct research or present research over Summer/Fall 2026

- 1. <u>Conditions</u>. To apply for the award, the student should:
 - a) Be a Miami undergraduate studying anthropology, with first preference given to majors with some advanced coursework in anthropology.
 - b) Propose to conduct original research or present original research at a regional, national, or international academic or professional conference.
 - c) Submit a brief written report of results, findings, and/or conference outcomes within 6 months of the date of award, or before the student graduates, whichever comes first.
 - d) Provide an accounting (with receipts) of expenditure of award funds.
- 2. <u>Application</u>. To be considered, an applicant must submit a dossier consisting of the following:
 - a) For proposed research: Proposal of the research to be undertaken (750-1000 words), including a brief introduction, research question(s), methodology, project significance, and projected budget; To present research: Summary of research to be presented (400-500 words); and 400-500 word statement regarding expected outcomes of presenting research (i.e., what do you hope to learn, experience, or try, and how does this fit into your overall professional goals).
 - b) Transcript of courses taken and grades earned (unofficial transcripts will be accepted);
 - c) Resumé/curriculum vitae;
 - d) Letter of recommendation from a faculty member or equivalent (emailed directly to Erica Keener, keenere@MiamiOH.edu);
 - e) One-page cover letter indicating the applicant's reasons for applying for the award.

- 3. <u>Deadlines</u>. The completed application packet must be emailed to the Department of Anthropology Administrative Assistant, Erica Keener, <u>keener@MiamiOH.edu</u>, by 4 PM on the indicated deadline: Fall deadline: December 1, 2025; Spring Deadline: April 1, 2026.
- 5. <u>Committee</u>. Proposals will be evaluated and ranked by the student scholarship committee, which currently consists of Kelsey Ellis (<u>elliskm3@MiamiOH.edu</u>), Jeb Card (<u>cardjj@maimioh.edu</u>), Neringa Klumbyte (<u>klumbn@MiamiOH.edu</u>), and Leighton Peterson (<u>lpeterson@MiamiOH.edu</u>). Recommendations will be submitted to the Chair of Anthropology (Cameron Hay-Rollins: hayrolmc@MiamiOH.edu) within two weeks of submission for final consideration. Each committee member is pleased to answer any questions about the award.
- 6. <u>Award</u>. You may request up to \$2,000, although awards typically range between \$200 and \$500, to help offset costs incurred while engaging in or presenting scholarly research, such as travel, lodging, food, and/or supplies. The committee cannot award you funds you do not adequately justify. As such, please make sure to justify your budget by listing all requested items, including a rationale for items essential to the project success, and please explain why you require any unusual or particularly costly items listed in your budget.
