
It's not a traditional tourist type of venture, she said.

She said a major appeal of the Project Dragonfly program, which is also coordinated by the Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Garden, is it involves hands-on learning and direct interaction with a culture.

Her involvement with the program began in 2008 with a trip to Belize.
