Undergraduate students participate in a variety of internally and externally supported research and service projects. They present their findings at professional conferences and are often included as co-authors with faculty mentors on publications.





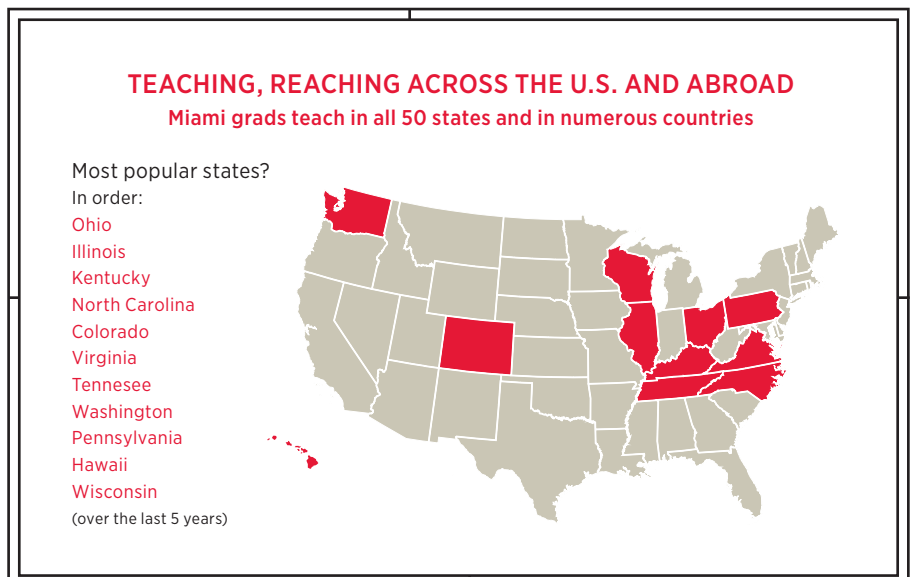
Education (Teaching)

- Teacher specific job fair connecting undergraduates and alumni with school districts across the country.
- Live and teach in an urban area with our place-based Urban Cohort program.
- Opportunity to Student Teach Abroad.
- Nationally-accredited programs prepare students for the Ohio licensure exam(s).
- Dual licensure option for Special Education and Primary Education. Get two teaching licenses in four years.
- All teacher licensure programs can be completed in four years, including a full semester of student teaching. Ohio licensure has great reciprocity with other states.

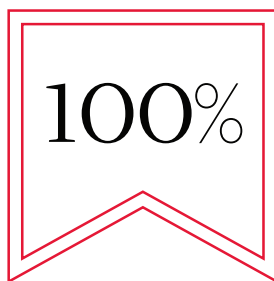

- Kinesiology major is often combined with the Pre-Medical and Pre-Health co-majors and can be used as bachelors degree for those who want to pursue Athletic Training, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, etc. in graduate school. - Clinical experiences include sport practices and games with Miami Athletics (Division I and club), local high schools, clinics and other affiliated clinical sites.
- State-of-the-Art Technology including the Anatomage table which offers life-size virtual dissection visualization of 3D human anatomy and a life-size patient simulator (METiman) where students can monitor pulse, heartbeat, respirations, pupil dilation and other physiological factors.
- Additional labs include: Body Composition Lab, Cardiovascular Lab, Dietetics Lab, Human Performance Lab, Motor Behavior and Biomechanics Lab, Muscle Physiology/Wet Lab, Neuromuscular Lab, Vascular Physiology Lab, and the Sensory Lab.

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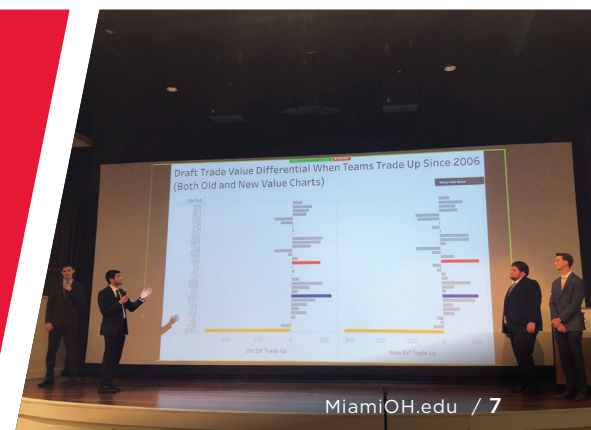

SUMMER ACADEMY

The Sport Analytics Summer Academy (SASA) is a four-week, on campus summer program designed to engage students, community members, and sport business leaders with an understanding of how sport organizations analyze, interpret, and communicate data efficiently and effectively in sport.

Sport Analytics Minor and hands-on sport analytics experience with collegiate teams offered every semester.



Social Work

PROGRAM FEATURES

- Miami's undergraduate social work program is fully accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE).
- Social work graduates are eligible for licensing in Ohio and other states.
- Senior year, students complete an internship at an agency through a guided match process based on individual interests and career goals.
- Graduates are eligible for our advanced standing program — an accelerated pathway to complete the Master of Social Work (MSW) degree in one year.
- Upon completion of the BSW degree, graduates are eligible to apply for provisional certification as a Family Life Educator from the National Council on Family Relations.
- Certified Child Life Specialists often work in pediatric hospitals but may also work in other spaces where children may experience illness-related trauma.
- May take up to two graduate-level courses senior year that count towards the BSW and MSW degree.
