She has recently had two coauthored papers accepted: "Pipeline Hiring's Effects on Human Capital and New Recruits' Performance" by Strategic Management Journal and "Impact Pathways: A Call for Impactful Research in Supply Chain GHG Emissions Reduction" by the International Journal of Operations and Production Management.

Additionally, Research.com named her one of the top global (143rd in the world) and national (81st in the US) Business and Management Scientists based on H-Index citation counts.
