FIVE PILLARS OF THE COMMUNITY

Scholarship and Learning

Each chapter commits itself to the tenet of enhancing scholarship and learning within the chapter. As a result, members of Miami's fraternities and sororities consistently earn GPAs above campus averages for both men and women.

Service and Philanthropy

One of the most rewarding aspects of fraternity and sorority involvement is the opportunity to impact the lives of others. Last year, Miami Greeks completed over 37,000 service hours and donated over \$320,000 through service projects and philanthropic fundraisers.

Leadership and Values

Miami's Greek community is dedicated to developing strong, multi-faceted leaders. Fraternity and sorority life provides an outstanding means for the discovery and implementation of each member's unique leadership potential by encouraging individuals to strive for positive change in their organizations and the community.

Community

The Greek community has been thriving for over 190 years at Miami, and it offers engaging opportunities that are hard to match elsewhere. Whether it is a fraternity or sorority sponsored service, philanthropy, athletic event, or speaker, students grow as individuals through their Greek involvement.

Brotherhood and Sisterhood

Within each chapter, there is a close bond of friendship and family. This is one of the foundations of the Greek experience and is a cornerstone that each organization is built upon. The unique personalities of fraternity and sorority members provide a diverse and well-rounded Greek community.



RECRUITMENT AND INTAKE ELIGIBILITY

All four governing councils and individual chapters may establish standards of membership including, but not limited to, credit hour and grade point average requirements. To affiliate with a fraternity or sorority, a student must have completed all of the below requirements prior to the start of the recruitment or intake process.

Minimum Eligibility Requirements

- One full-time fall or spring semester (at Miami University or other accredited institution of higher education).
- 12 college credit hours (does not include AP, IB, dual-enrollment credit achieved in high school).
- At least a 2.5 minimum, cumulative, grade point average for Panhellenic, MGC, and NPHC organizations and at least a minimum 2.75 for IFC fraternities. Transfer GPAs cannot be combined only the most recent college GPA received will be considered.
 - For first year students, only the fall GPA will be considered. The Cliff Office does not accept Winter Term grades to determine recruitment eligibility.
- Completion of two assigned online education modules.
- Student eligibility will be verified through the Cliff Alexander Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life prior to the chapter extending any form of invitation to membership. Only transcripts from the most recent institution attended will be considered.



SECOND-YEAR HOUSING

Fraternity House Living

Miami University recognizes the benefits a strong fraternity community has on the undergraduate experience. An important component of that experience is providing the opportunity for undergraduate men to live with their fraternity brothers in a safe environment that is supportive of a student's academic success and personal development. Because of this commitment to fraternity and student success, men have the opportunity to live in fraternity houses during their second year. Students must meet the minimum requirements set by Miami University and the individual chapters in order to be eligible to live in the houses. Men must have a 2.75 cumulative GPA and must not have any conduct violations reported through the Office of Community Standards.

Men must submit an application in order to be considered for second year exemption. Individual chapters also have to meet certain requirements to be eligible to have sophomores live in the chapter house. All requirements are reviewed and verified by the Cliff Alexander Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life.

Sorority Living Learning Community

The Sorority Living Learning Community (LLC) was created to allow our sorority women to enhance their collegiate experience and strengthen their sisterhood by living with members from their chapter and women from other chapters. The expectation is that all sorority women in Panhellenic chapters live in the Sorority LLC during their second year at Miami. Sorority LLC applications open in early March after the primary recruitment process has concluded.



Fraternity and Sorority

TERMINOLOGY

ACTIVE – a fully initiated undergraduate member of a fraternity or sorority.

ALUMNUS/ALUMNA – an initiated member who has graduated from college.

BADGE/PIN – the pin of an initiated member. Many new members also wear a version of this called a new member pin prior to initiation.

BID - an invitation to join a fraternity or sorority.

BIG BROTHER OR SISTER – an active member of a fraternity or sorority who serves as a sponsor, advisor and special friend to a new member, guiding them through their new member program and initiation.

BROTHER/SISTER – a term used by active members in a chapter when referring to each other.

CHAPTER – the local group at an individual campus of the larger national organization, designated by a special Greek name.

DEPLEDGE - to terminate one's fraternity or sorority membership before initiation; those who depledge a fraternity or sorority may not pledge another fraternity or sorority until the next recruitment period. FORMAL/PRIMARY RECRUITMENT - the period of time in early spring semester where Panhellenic and IFC chapters get to know potential new members and offer bids. This is the time when first year students can be offered bids from a chapter within IFC or Panhellenic.

FRATERNITY – the name that applies to all Greek letter organizations characterized by a ritual, pin and strong ties to friendship and moral principles. Informally, many women's fraternities are called sororities.

GREEK – historical term describing any member of a Greek letter social organization (fraternity or sorority).

INFORMAL RECRUITMENT – all dates and times other than those of formal/primary recruitment, during which chapters may offer bids to students beyond their second semester.

INITIATED MEMBER – any member who has completed the new member process, has gone through the initiation ceremony and is currently enrolled in college.

INITIATION – the formal ceremony that marks the beginning of chapter membership. Each chapter has a different set of requirements in order to be initiated.



INTAKE –the process MGC and NPHC chapters conduct to recruit, interview, select, and educate new members.

INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL (IFC) – the governing body of fraternities at Miami University. IFC operates under the affiliation requirements of the National Interfraternity Council (NIC).

INTERNATIONAL/NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS – the central organization of a particular fraternity or sorority.

MULTICULTURAL GREEK COUNCIL (MGC) – the umbrella organization of Miami University's culturallybased organizations. MGC is the supporting organization to all represented chapters and their operations individually and collectively.

NEW MEMBER – a member of a fraternity or sorority who has not been initiated.

NEW MEMBER EDUCATION PROGRAM – time during which new members learn the history, ideals and values of fraternity and sorority life and of their individual chapter.

North-American Interfraternity Conference (NIC) – governing body of 58 national member men's fraternities and alumni associations.

National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) – a national organization composed of 26 member sororities, each of which is autonomous as a social, Greek letter society composed of both undergraduates and alumnae.

National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) – a national organization composed of four sororities and five fraternities whose membership is historically African-American, and locally the supporting council for these groups.

OPEN HOUSE – part of IFC fraternity recruitment, when potential members are given a chance to see all the participating chapters.

PANHELLENIC ASSOCIATION – the representative governing body of all sororities. The Panhellenic Association operates under the direction of the National Panhellenic Council (NPC). PHILANTHROPY – a charitable project to raise money for an organization or foundation sponsored by fraternities and sororities.

POTENTIAL NEW MEMBER – a college student who is participating in the recruitment process.

QUOTA – the specified number of potential new members to which each Panhellenic sorority may extend a bid during primary recruitment.

RECRUITMENT - the process of mutual selection between prospective members and active chapters.

RHO GAMMA – sorority women that assist potential members through the Panhellenic primary recruitment process by providing information about the fraternity and sorority community, answering their questions, and being a supportive guide during the recruitment period.

RITUAL – a ceremonial event, unique to each chapter, based on ideals established by the chapter's founding members.

SOCIAL – a get-together with another group for a party, dinner, or other occasion.

SORORITY - a fraternity for women.

SPRITE DATES – a weekend in the fall semester where potential new members can meet women in recruiting Panhellenic chapters before primary recruitment in the spring.

SUITE – room where sorority chapters hold meetings, study and socialize. MGC, NPHC, and Panhellenic sororities have suites located in the Sorority LLC on Central Quad.

An "unrecognized" fraternity or sorority is one which may choose to exist "off campus" and does not follow university policies and regulations. These organizations are not permitted to use university facilities, post flyers, or have any of the privileges recognized organizations have earned.

GET TO KNOW THE INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL

The Interfraternity Council (IFC) is composed of 26 member fraternities and governed by 10 annually elected IFC executive board officers. The fraternity and sorority community at Miami University has one of the richest Greek traditions in the nation, recognized by many as the "Mother of Fraternities."

IFC Recruitment

IFC Spring Formal Recruitment will take place Jan. 27-Feb. 1 and is alcohol and substance free.

REGISTRATION

All prospective members must register to participate in recruitment before attending formal recruitment events. Register at **MiamiOH.edu/FSLL.** There is a \$25 registration fee.

BID PROCESS

Chapters can begin to hand out bids on Monday, Jan. 27. Bids given in residence halls must be given outside or in common areas with permission of the residence hall. Potential new members must accept their bid in the online recruitment system by 5 p.m. on Feb. 1.

Intake FAQs

When do MGC and NPHC organizations start the process of taking in new members?

MGC and NPHC chapters conduct intake in either the fall or spring semester. Chapters conduct intake at their own discretion and based on the needs of the chapter.

Do I have to identify as a person of color to join an organization/chapter (i.e. Latinx for MGC or African-American for NPHC)?

No. MGC, NPHC, and their respective chapters have nondiscriminatory policies and practices. All racial identities are welcomed to seek membership and learn more about the uniqueness of each council and their chapters.

How do I express interest in joining a MGC or NPHC organization/chapter?

The most common way to express interest is to attend the organization's programs, events, or service projects. You are not expected to go to everything the chapter hosts, but showing face and engaging with the chapter is a good start to expressing your interest. Some organizations (not all) will host an informational meeting for potential new members to express interest and ask questions of current chapter members.

How do I become a member of one of the organizations within MGC or NPHC?

MGC and NPHC organizations may recruit and conduct their membership intake differently. Membership intake is under the full operation of the respective chapter and their national organization. Most require an invitation to be extended and an interview to be conducted to the person of interest. However, each chapter has their own requirements of becoming a member. Chapters and the councils strongly recommend those interested to do their research on the organization and visit the national headquarters website to learn more about how to join and the requirements needed.

Between the MGC and NPHC, is one council better than the other?

No. Each council and their respective chapters are unique, with their own traditions. Both councils bring a different perspective of what "traditional" fraternity and sorority life is and can look like. The councils equally bring rich history to the community. Ultimately, both councils provide open doors for interested students to find a sense of belonging within the fraternity and sorority community that they may not have thought possible.



GET TO KNOW THE **PANHELLENIC ASSOCIATION**

The Panhellenic Association is the coordinating body for activities that promote the common interest of its sororities on Miami's campus. As the unifying and governing body of the sorority community, Panhellenic offers a wide variety of programs for members ranging from self care to educational programs to community service activities. The Panhellenic Association also sponsors and coordinates Miami's sorority primary recruitment which occurs at the start of the spring semester.

As the communication link between the sororities, campus organizations, and community leaders, the Panhellenic executive board serves a multitude of purposes. Through various programs, it seeks to provide personal enrichment and knowledge to all fraternity and sorority members. The executive board's influence is a crucial part of sorority life - one that promotes a stronger fraternity and sorority community.

Recruitment FAQs

What is recruitment?

Recruitment is the process by which IFC and Panhellenic chapters on campus introduce themselves to prospective members. During this time you are invited to visit the chapters to learn about what each group has to offer. Each council has a different schedule, IFC recruitment occurs over one week and Panhellenic recruitment occurs over two weekends.

What are the requirements to join?

Students must meet the following requirements before joining the recruitment process:

- One full-time fall or spring semester.
- 12 college credit hours (does not include, AP, IB, or dual-enrollment credit achieved in high school).
- At least a 2.75 minimum, cumulative GPA for Interfraternity Council fraternities and a 2.5 minimum, cumulative GPA for Panhellenic sororities. (Transfer GPAs cannot be combined – only the most recent college GPA received will be considered).
- For first year students, only the fall GPA will be considered. The Cliff Office does not accept Winter Term/J-Term grades to determine recruitment eligibility.
- Completion of two assigned online educational modules.

Eligibility will be verified through the Cliff Alexander Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life.

How many chapters are there?

The Interfraternity Council is made up of 26 fraternities and Panhellenic is made up of 18 sororities that are all nationally recognized and in good standing with Miami University.

Can my Winter Term grades count towards the GPA requirement to go through recruitment?

No, the Cliff Office does not accept Winter Term/J-Term grades to determine recruitment eligibility. This means that you have to complete the fall semester with a 2.75 GPA at minimum for IFC or a 2.5 GPA for Panhellenic.

How much does it cost to be part of a fraternity or sorority?

Joining a fraternity or sorority does carry a financial commitment. Each chapter sets its own dues for the academic year, they vary in cost from new member to active member. Dues go towards inter/national fees, social functions, chapter operating expenses, and educational programs and initiatives. The Cliff Alexander Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life has updated information, but it is best to talk to each chapter individually about the associated costs for a more detailed breakdown.

What are Panhellenic Sprite Dates?

Sprite Dates are informal open house style events for potential new members to meet current chapter members prior to recruitment in the spring. It's a casual setting, held in the chapter suites, that allows students to get to know our chapters in a more relaxed atmosphere.

Do I need a letter of recommendation to go through Panhellenic recruitment?

No! Letters of recommendation are not required. For Panhellenic recruitment, if you know a sorority woman who wants to write a letter of recommendation on your behalf, it should be sent directly to the chapters. More information about letters of recommendation can be found at **MiamiOHpanhellenic.org**. IFC does not accept letters of recommendation.

Can I go through recruitment if I am an athlete?

Absolutely, many athletes join our community each year! For IFC recruitment, there is not a set schedule. Students can attend chapter open houses throughout the week. Student-athletes can get to know the chapters whenever best fits their schedule. Please keep in mind that chapters can begin to hand out bids starting on the Monday of recruitment.

It is required that potential new members going through the Panhellenic process attend all rounds for which they are invited. However, if you have scheduling conflicts with recruitment because you are a student-athlete, Panhellenic will do their best to accommodate your schedule so you can participate.

Does everyone participating in recruitment receive a bid?

It is not guaranteed that everyone participating in the IFC recruitment process will receive a bid. It is up to the chapters to select who they want to offer bids to.

Panhellenic recruitment is a mutual selection process. Each chapter has their own criteria for membership and it is not guaranteed that you will be asked back to all of the chapters you loved. However, if you go through the entire recruitment process *and* rank all of the chapters you visited for preference round, you are guaranteed a bid. It may not be a bid from your first choice chapter. On the other hand, if you do **not** rank all the chapters you visited during preference round, or you intentionally preference a single chapter, there is no guarantee that you will be offered a bid.
