We will also be examining whether self-esteem and self-perceived mate value potentially mediate the association between acceptance and rejection and mating aspirations. [Master's Thesis]

"Understanding the antecedents of suspicion in cyber environments: An experiment using Cyberball to induce state suspicion"

• Examining, via Cyberball, whether differences in level of ostracism (fully ostracized, partially ostracized, and equally included) and differences in the type of players the participants are told they are playing against (real players, pre-programmed computer players, human-like players) influence state suspicion.

"Do Facebook profile photos influence one's perceived personality and likability"

• Investigated whether gender and/or content of a Facebook photo (a person pictured with cats or with friends) influenced one's perceived personality and likability.

"Self-objectification and social functioning in close relationships: Body shame as a predictor of social intimacy and loneliness"

• Examined associations between women's self-objectification (self-surveillance and body shame) and social functioning in close relationships, specifically measuring social intimacy and loneliness.
