## TEACHING AND ADVISING

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### *Teaching*

I currently teach the classes listed below, which connect to my research agenda and scholarship by focusing on the socio-cultural aspects of sport, leisure, and physical activity. My overall teaching effectiveness mean score is 3.75 out of 4 across all classes. I also score consistently high in the categories that measure opportunities for student participation (3.90 out of 4), the instructor's demonstration of concern for student learning and well-being (3.89 out of 4), and a learning environment conducive to student questions (3.94 out of 4).
