CAREER OVERVIEW

A member of the faculty at Miami University since 1984, Dr. Vealey's teaching, research, and service are focused within the social and performance psychology of sport. She teaches courses in sport psychology, coaching psychology, youth sport, and mental health/wellbeing in sport, and has received numerous teaching awards including the Outstanding Teacher/Advisor Award from the College of Education, Health and Society and multiple university Effective Educator awards and top 100 most-commended faculty commendations.

Dr. Vealey works extensively with graduate students in sport psychology and has co-authored multiple scholarly publications and presentations with students. She has supervised 45 Master's theses. Her students have won the Distinguished Thesis Award (2006) as well as the Master's Student Professional Practice Award (2017) from the Association for Applied Sport Psychology. In 2011, she won the Distinguished Award for Excellence in Graduate Teaching and Mentoring from Miami University. In 2016, she received the Delp Outstanding Faculty Award given to a professor who has significantly influenced the lives of students through teaching, advising and research in the College of Education, Health and Society at Miami University. In 2022, she received the Kate Hays Distinguished Mentor Award from the Association for Applied Sport Psychology.

Dr. Vealey has authored four books: *Successful Coaching* (5th ed., 2023), *Coaching for the Inner Edge* (2nd ed., 2022), *Best Practice in Youth Sport* (2016), and *Competitive Anxiety in Sport* (1990). In addition, has published over 80 articles and book chapters in sport psychology and made over 300 scholarly and applied presentations to regional, national, and international audiences, including multiple invited international keynote presentations. Her invited international scholarly presentation venues include Thailand, Australia, South Africa, Israel, China, Colombia, Spain, Italy, Germany, Canada, and the United Kingdom. She is a Fellow in the National Academy of Kinesiology and the Association for Applied Sport Psychology

(AASP), In 1995, she received the Distinguished Scholar Award from the Australian Psychological Society.

Dr. Vealey served as Editor of the international refereed journal *The Sport Psychologist* for a five-year term, and she is a Past-President of AASP, the largest sport psychological professional organization in the world. She currently is on the editorial boards of the *International Journal of Sport and Exercise Psychology*, the *Journal of Applied Sport Psychology*, the *International Sport Coaching Journal*, and the *Journal of Imagery Research in Sport and Physical Activity*. She also served on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Sport & Exercise Psychology*, *The Sport Psychologist*, and the *Journal of Sport Behavior*.

Dr. Vealey has worked as a sport psychology consultant for organizations including the U.S. Ski Team and U.S. Field Hockey, and currently consults with elite athletes, Miami University athletes and teams, and local high school athletes and teams. She is a Certified Mental Performance Consultant (CMPC) as recognized by AASP, and regularly supervises Miami students who are seeking CMPC certification. She is the faculty coordinator for the Miami Mental Performance Group (MMPG), a group of students who provide workshops and individual consultation for mental performance and wellbeing.

She served as the inaugural Chair of the Certification Council for AASP between 2017-2020, which is responsible for the governance and national accreditation of the CMPC certification program. Dr. Vealey was the primary writer for the application and report that resulted in the accreditation of the CMPC program in 2020 by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies and the Institute for Credentialing Excellence, a major professional milestone for the field of sport psychology.

SCHOLARLY FOCUS AREAS

Dr. Vealey's scholarship focuses on the understanding and enhancement of the "achieving mentality" in sport. The achieving mentality necessitates cognitive characteristics such as confidence and motivation, as well as an agile mindset of mental skills and coping abilities. However, the achieving mentality required in the public social evaluation environment of sport competition can lead to anxiety, burnout, and perfectionism, all possible threats to athletes' wellbeing and mental health.

To examine both sides of the achieving mentality, Dr. Vealey has developed lines of research in sport-confidence, competitive anxiety, burnout, and mental skills. She also has written extensively about professional issues in sport psychology and coaching effectiveness. Her current and emerging work incorporates the mental health/wellbeing component into the mental skills model, as a critical societal need to combat the mental health risks inherent in organized sport.
