College Credit Plus (CCP) is an opportunity for high school students to simultaneously earn college credit and high school credit. By participating in Ohio's CCP program, Miami University Regionals provides qualified students an exceptional opportunity to advance their college education prior to high school graduation. SCHOLARSHIP CONSIDERATION

First-time college students graduating high school must submit a completed admission application, including official high school transcripts and ACT/SAT scores, by **February 1** for merit scholarship consideration.

MIAMI REGIONALS MERIT SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Test score range	HS GPA (4.00 scale)	First-year scholarship award range
22+	3.25-3.49	up to \$1,500
22+	3.50-3.74	up to \$2,000
22+	3.75-4.0+	up to \$2,500

\$1,000 per academic year may be renewable based on maintained merit with at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA as a full-time continuing student.

Students originally applying to the Oxford campus can request their application be moved to Miami Regionals. Students requesting this move by May 1 will be considered for a merit scholarship as long as all documents were on file with the university by the February 1 deadline.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP

Transfer students must submit a completed admission application, including all official college transcripts, by the dates below:

- Fall Semester: June 1
- Spring Semester: December 1

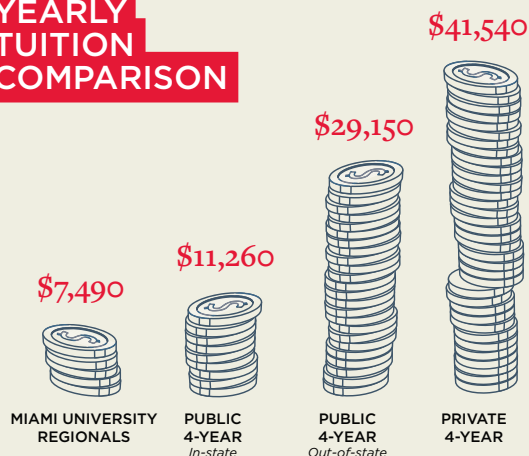

Cumulative Transfer GPA (4.0 scale)	First-year scholarship award range
3.0-3.24	\$500-\$1,000
3.25-3.49	\$750-\$1,500
3.5-4.0	\$1,000-\$2,000
